



The Obligations of a Dutiful Servant

Considering a Message from Luke 17:1-10

For the Week of August 5th, 2018

This Sunday of the Church Year focuses on “Renewed Obedience.” It is a time of introspection for us to consider what God wants of us and how we might be dedicated in our service to Him and to His purposes.

As Christians, God has given us duties and obligations to follow. These can be very challenging for us—especially the task of repentance. As God’s people we value daily renewal as we admit our wrongs, and lovingly encourage those around us to do likewise. “Repent!” has been God’s repeated message to His people—as we hear through His prophets: “Amend your ways and your doings.” (Jer. 7:1-7). Those who are not repentant—who are not fulfilling these duties and obligations—are failing because they lack true faith in God. Through faith we leave behind our own unrighteousness and failures, and receive Christ’s righteousness and success. Not only does faith in Christ impart His righteousness to us, it causes love to flow out of our hearts. It inspires us to cheerfully and happily carry out our duty and obligations as God’s servants. We then work together as dutiful servants of God, making use of the different gifts that we each have, showing love to each other and to God, glorifying Him as we serve Him and for the good of His kingdom (1 Cor. 12:1-11).

Opening Prayer: We thank You Heavenly Father for bringing us together. Send Your Holy Spirit to help us grow in faith and love, especially as we gather together with our fellow Christians. Help us as we now consider how we might be dutiful servants. Inspire and motivate us to carry out our obligations happily as we consider the great love that you have shown to us through our Savior, Your Son, Jesus. We pray this in His name. Amen.

CONNECT to Each Other

Take a few moments to greet each other—especially anyone who might be new or unfamiliar to the people in your group. Introduce yourselves again if anyone is unfamiliar with anyone else, give an interesting factoid about yourself that not many people know...

1. Have you ever had a job where you felt overwhelmed? Were there obligations or duties that you weren’t prepared for or that frightened you? Please share...
2. What is it about the words ‘duty’ or ‘dutiful’ that we don’t find appealing? Similarly, why don’t we like the idea of being a “servant” to anyone else?

CONNECT to the Word—Read the Bible text together (also consider its context): **Luke 17:1-10**

3. Jesus issues a serious warning against anyone who would harm the faith of a young Christian. Why might His stern words be startling to many?

4. Why is it often difficult for people to confront another person about their sins?



5. What moves us to be radical in our forgiveness?—even forgiving someone “seven times in a single day”?

CONNECT to Life

6. Why should we see ourselves as those who have merely “done our duty” when we live out our lives as Christians?

7. Why is it comforting to know that our relationship with God doesn’t hinge on our performance of the law?

8. How did the hymns, other lessons, parts of the service, etc. fit together with the Sermon message and overall theme for the day?
