



A Beautiful Scene on a Beautiful Mountain

Considering a Message from Isaiah 25:6-9

For the Week of November 4th, 2018

The church has observed the Feast of All Saints since the mid 300s AD. On this specially appointed day, the church recalls the memory of all the faithful departed and the triumph of Christ over all false gods. Though we recall the saints who have departed from the troubles of this life—a life of difficulty and hardship described by Jesus in His Sermon on the Mount (Matt 5:1-12)—it is not a day of sorrow or sadness, but rather a day of joy and celebration. Jesus' words, after all, from in His Sermon on the Mount declares us "Blessed" or "Happy" in spite of the difficulties we face. This is a "Blessedness" or "Happiness" that comes from knowing the eternal blessings God gives to His people. We celebrate the fact that those who have departed in the faith are living and even now communing with us around the throne of the Lamb in Heaven. Though we may mourn and miss those who have departed, we rejoice in knowing that they are enjoying the great feast of Heaven (Is 25:6-9) and that we too will join them there; for we, too, are saints because of the salvation shared with us through the work of the Lamb, our Lord Jesus Christ (Rev 7:10). The Hymn selections for the day are also designed to point us to the joys of heaven. Also, the celebration of the Lord's Supper also gives us an opportunity to join together with "angels, archangels, and all the company of heaven" in a glorious meal where God provides for His people and draws them all to Himself.

Opening Prayer: We thank You Heavenly Father for bringing us together. Send Your Holy Spirit to help us grow in faith and love, especially as we gather together with our fellow Christians. Give us joy in knowing the treasures that you have waiting for Your people in Heaven. As we live our lives here on earth keep us heavenly minded and focused on our eternal future with You. We pray this in Jesus' name. Amen.

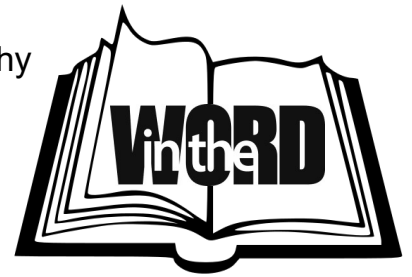
1. Can you recall an especially enjoyable picnic, banquet, or family meal that you've experienced? What was it that made it so great?

3. These verses speak of an elaborate, rich feast in Heaven! In this world, if we enjoyed such things constantly, our health might be at risk. Will things like cholesterol, hypertension, obesity, and diabetes be ongoing problems in heaven?

4. Are you confident that this Heavenly feast is in your future? Why or Why Not? Explain...



5. There is much that we do not know or understand about the world to come—just as there is much we do not understand about God. But what promise is held out for those in heaven in verse 7?

6. Here in this world we experience sadness, fear, and discouragement. But what does God promise for those in heaven in verse 8?

7. How does God prepare you NOW for the feast that is to come in Heaven?
8. How did the hymns, other lessons, parts of the service, etc. fit together with the Sermon message and overall theme for the day?
