Welcome! In the name of our risen Savior we welcome you to Mt. Olive and thank you for worshipping with us. If you are a guest, please fill out a "Get Connected!" card (found in front of you in the hymnbook rack). We invite you to come and worship with us again soon. Large Print copies of the order of service from the ELS Hymnary are available from the usher stand in the back of the sanctuary.

**Explanation of the Week:** The voice of the Baptizer cried out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord" (Is 40:1-8). John called the people to be made ready for the Messiah's coming through repentance, for "all flesh is grass." Now He asks from prison, "Are you the Coming One?" (Mt 11:2-10). Jesus' works bear witness that He is. The sick are made well; the dead are raised, and the poor have the gospel preached to them. Their iniquity is pardoned; they have received from the Lord's hand double forgiveness for all their sins. The stewards of the mysteries of God (1 Cor 4:1-5) still deliver Christ's overflowing forgiveness to the poor in spirit, comforting God's people with the word of the Gospel which stands forever. God's Gospel is shared with us through Jesus so that through Him we "are not consumed" by His anger (Malachi 3:1-6). Instead, we have reason to rejoice and be glad!

## I. The Service of Preparation



(We prepare ourselves for worshiping God by acknowledging our unworthiness to stand before Him, and by receiving His forgiveness through absolution (forgiveness). We respond with thanks and joy.)

P: Beloved in the Lord! Let us draw near with a true heart and confess our sins to God, our Father, beseeching Him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.

P: Our help is in the name of the Lord.

C: A Who made heav'n and earth.

P: I said, I will confess my transgressions to the Lord;

P: Almighty God, our heavenly Father, has had mercy upon us and has given His only-begotten Son to die for us, and for His sake forgives us all our sins. To all who believe on His name He gives power to become the children of God, and has promised them His Holy Spirit. He who believes and is baptized shall be saved.

C: Grant this unto us, O Lord. Amen.

#### II. The Service of the Word



(After receiving the forgiveness of sins, we thanked God by singing His praises and praying to Him. He now increases our faith through His holy Word which we hear through the Lessons and especially through the Sermon where God's Word is applied to our lives today.)

Malachi 3:1-6 Look! I am sending my messenger! He will prepare the way before me. Then suddenly the Lord, whom you are seeking, will come to his temple! The Messenger of the Covenant, in whom you delight, will surely come, says the Lord of Armies. But who can endure the day when he comes? Who will remain standing when he appears? For he will be like a refiner's fire, like launderers bleach! He will be seated like a refiner and a purifier of silver. He will purify the sons of Levi and refine them like gold and like silver. They will belong to the Lord and bring him an offering in righteousness. Judah and Jerusalem's offerings will be pleasing to the Lord as they were in the days of old, in years long ago. I will approach you to judge you. I will be quick to give testimony against those who practice occult arts, those who commit adultery, those who swear false oaths, those who cheat workers out of their wages, those who wrong a widow and a fatherless child, those who turn away a resident alien—all those who do not fear me, says the Lord of Armies. Certainly I, the Lord, do not change. That is why you, sons of Jacob, have not come to an end.

*1 Corinthians 4:1-5* This is the way a person should think of us: as servants of Christ and stewards of God's mysteries. In this connection, moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found faithful. But it is a trivial matter to me if I am evaluated by you or by a day in a human court. Why, I do not even evaluate myself. I do not in fact know of anything against myself, but I am not justified by this; rather, the one who evaluates me is the Lord. Therefore judge nothing ahead of time, until the Lord comes. He will bring to light whatever is hidden in darkness and also reveal the intentions of hearts. Then there will be praise for each person from God.

# III. The Service of Holy Communion



(Following Christ's command, we receive His grace to us in the special meal He instituted for the forgiveness of our sins. Here, He feeds with His true body and His true blood in, with, and under the bread and wine. This is the same body which was born of the Virgin Mary, and the same blood which dripped down the wooden cross. This part of the liturgy is one of the oldest parts, dating back to at least the third century AD.)

Questions and prayers to assist in preparing for the Lord's Supper are found in the black hymnal, pp. 38–40.

Guests & Visitors: We practice "Close" or "Closed Communion". We do this out of love and concern for you. We want to make sure that those who take this holy meal receive it as a blessing and not to their harm as Scripture warns. We also understand that those who come forward to take communion are professing a unity of faith with our congregation and are in full agreement with the teachings and doctrines of Mount Olive Lutheran Church and of the Evangelical Lutheran Synod. Therefore, we ask those who have not taken Holy Communion with us before to speak with a pastor before communing. Thank you.

#### **News from the Narthex Committee:**

A Narthex Committee was established to address the use, furnishing, and decorating of the wonderful new space we have been blessed with. This Committee consists of a cross section of members with different talents and interests.

Some action taken at our most recent meeting:

- 1. Furniture was selected and will be purchased when it is funded through the Special Giving Opportunities list. Two seating areas are planned which can easily be moved for overflow seating.
- 2. Wall decorations will be decided after the furniture is in place.
- 3. Coat racks were moved to the old narthex area where they will be kept when the temperature warrants their use. Signage will eventually be added in the new narthex to indicate their location.
- 4. Funds were approved for purchasing chairs for overflow seating. Chairs and storage rack will be purchased soon.
- 5. We also ask for the congregation's help in making sure that the new narthex area is a warm, inviting place that remains free of clutter. To help ensure this, we ask the following:
  - Groups: please check with the church office before placing items on the information table located near the old offices/entry area.
  - The Welcome Table is to remain in its place and will be maintained by the church office.
  - Please refrain from taping any signs to the walls.
  - Tables for special events (e.g. bake sales) should be set up in the hallway by the old offices.

Many more items are being discussed, and more changes are yet to come. Thank you for your help and cooperation.
